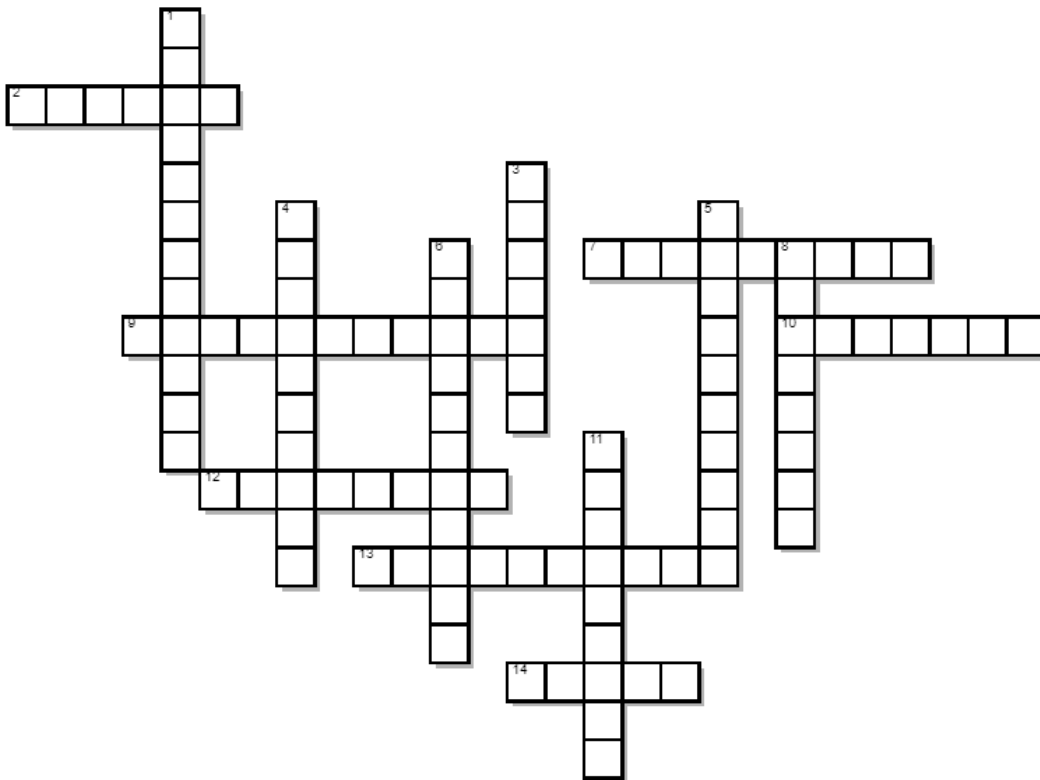




## State Symbols
